- **Grade 7** (second dose to be given in April)
Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (Tdap) vaccine;
Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccines (2 doses at 6 months interval)
- **Grade 8**
Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine (2nd dose ONLY)

In the past, we would have distributed paper documents in order to obtain consent. This year, the submission of the vaccine consent will be done online with an electronic version of the form that the parent will complete that will send directly to the Public Health. The link will be sent out when available.

Hello and welcome back to MMS! My name is Mrs. Reinsborough-Wadden (Mrs. RW, she/her) and I am pleased to be your school counsellor again this year. I wanted to introduce myself and encourage you to reach out if you have any questions, concerns, or celebrations to share. I am grateful that I'll have many opportunities to get to know your MMS student over the next school year. I often present in classrooms, visit in small groups, support during assemblies, arrange guest speakers, and work individually with students. My focus is on building school community, offering brief/solution-focused counselling support and mental health empowerment education. Our MMS extra-curricular commitments are such a serious joy, and I also look forward to re-launching our Gender-Sexuality-Alliance (GSA), Art Club, and Dungeons and Dragons (D and D) team at MMS again shortly. Our student Leadership team will be up and running soon, as well as our "Be a Kind Human" speaker series. Please encourage your MMS student to truly get involved in school life, and to consider signing up for one of the many clubs and committees that are offered here.

As a parent and educator, I know that this time of the school year can be both magical but also messy: it's our role as strong, supportive adults to share our calm and to model self-compassion to the youth in our lives as we transition from Summer to Fall. Here are a few mental health tips to help launch your school year: an enthusiastic pat on the back if you follow them already, and a gentle reminder to weave them into your family practice if they've fallen to the 'Summer backburner' these last few sunny months.

-Set up a morning routine and commit to it.

-Stay organized as a family unit: communicate schedules, rock your visual calendars, and set boundaries and expectations with time management. Try to eliminate 'surprises' from your everyday planning - it's helpful for everyone to feel prepared and informed.

-Celebrate and prioritize your sleep routine. A tired brain is not open to learning, and not at its best.

-Share your calm. If your MMS student is feeling frazzled by the constant changes that this stage of the school year offers, make sure you are modeling calm, even, warm-hearted responses for them to follow your lead. Always ask yourself "Am I being helpful?"

-Be a kind human: to yourself and others. We are in this together!

I'm looking forward to building relationships with our new students and our grade 5 crew, and to reconnecting with our 6, 7, and 8 students and families. Wishing everyone a fantastic school year ahead!

At Marshview, personal electronic devices are not permitted. This includes the use of smart phones and personal gaming devices. We do not have open wireless infrastructure and are updating our technology each year with school devices connected to our current system.

While social media outlets provide an amazing way to connect with each other, we have noticed an increase of social pressures and emotional damage from activities online. As a reminder, please talk to your child about their online presence. Ask your child to see their phones and social media accounts and monitor their posts. Great information can be found at www.kidsintheknow.ca or www.cybertip.ca . This is also a reminder that most social media sites require users to be at least 13 years old.

At school, ethical technology use is woven into our curriculum, and the use of Microsoft Teams and Office 365 are fantastic ways for our students to connect while learning. We continue to explore 21st Century technology skills with our students to ready them for real life applications.

We appreciate you not sending the phones to school and educating your child about regulation and addiction. Should you need to contact your child while they are at school, please phone the office and we are more than happy to give them a message. Students also have use of the school phone to reach parents. If you feel like your child requires a phone for after school use, the office is more than happy to hold them for the day for safe keeping.


Trochymchuk who worked so hard for our kids! Moving classroom furniture, scrubbing every inch, putting up
