Students will also be expected to continue with their nightly reading to continue to strengthen their fluency and comprehension. Next, we will return to social studies to look at ancient societies, in particular, Antiquity and the lost kingdom of Nubia.

#### **ELA NEWS:**



This month we will begin a class novel entitled <u>A</u> Dog's Life

and through this novel will be working on the skill of evaluating or formulating and supporting our opinions. Throughout this unit we will continue to practice reading and writing skills in various capacities learning and practicing how to properly express our personal opinions about specific topics. Students will also be exploring new vocabulary encountered in the novel through various word lists and word work exercises.



### MATHEMATICS NEWS:

In Math we will start the new year continuing our work on area and perimeter. Next, we will take some time to review whole numbers, working with numbers between one hundred thousand and one million. We will then move on to estimation, where we will learn strategies for estimating and use those strategies to help solve addition and subtraction questions. Students who do not yet know their times tables should please continue to review these nightly.
