## MATHEMATICS NEWS:

This final month of Grade 5 will see us move on to describing and representing decimals (tenths, hundredths, thousandths) concretely, pictorially and symbolically. We will relate decimals to fractions and fractions

to decimals (to thousandths), and compare and order decimals (to thousandths) by using benchmarks, place value and equivalent decimals. Finally, to finish the year, we will look at understanding the addition and subtraction of decimals (limited to thousandths).
