
Intramurals

Volunteers

We would love your help at times throughout the school year. As per Anglophone East policies and procedures, all volunteer applicants will have to successfully complete our screening process before beginning their volunteer work. As a first step, please complete our <u>Volunteer Application</u> Form

Once your application form has been submitted, we will be in touch with you via email and provide you with the following information:

- ▶ A personalized letter to get your Criminal Record Check / Vulnerable Sector completed at your local RCMP detachment, free of charge.
- ▶ A link to the EECD Policy 701: Protection of Pupils. The completion of the attached questionnaire/quiz is required.
- ▶ A copy of our Volunteer Confidentiality Agreement Form to sign.
- ► A link to review Policy 725: Protect and Prevent

Child & Youth Team (C&Y), Tantramar Cluster of Schools 506-869-6170

<u>Who we are:</u> We are an interdisciplinary team of professionals that work as one part of the Integrated Service Delivery (ISD) Model. Our team is comprised of a Psychologist/Resident in Psychology, Social Workers, Education Support Teacher – Autism/Resource (EST-A/R), and a Clinical Coordinator.

<u>What we do:</u> We work with children and youth who are struggling with mental health, substance use, academic, behavioural, or social/emotional challenges. We work in collaboration with school Education Support Services (ESS) Teams to help support students. Our services include one-on one counselling, assessments, and consultation with parents and teachers. We can also help connect children, youth, and families to other services in the community. This voluntary, year-round service is available to children and youth in the Tantramar school catchment area (Dorchester, Port Elgin, Salem, Marshview, TRHS), regardless of school attendance.

One-at-a-time / single session therapy: One-at-a-time therapy, also known as single session therapy, is now offered by the C&Y team. The service is offered by appointment, either virtually or in person with the goal of offering fast access to counselling. In this session, a specific, client-focused, strength-based approach is used to deal with the issue the individual wants to address. If ongoing therapy or other specialized care is a better fit, the counsellor will help navigate you towards the right level of support.

How do I make a request for services? The school's Education Support Services Teams (ESS) continue to be a point of access for C&Y services and follow the established process for referring to the C&Y team. Parents/guardians and youth (16+ years old) can call Child and Youth Services/Tantramar cluster directly at 506-869-6170 to request services & book an appointment. Other referral sources (including physician's offices, emergency departments, and any child and youth-serving agencies) can call or fax in a request for service to the Child and Youth Team - Tantramar Cluster.
