Food Bank Donations

In the 25 years since Anglophone East's "Fill The Bus" Campaign first started in 1999, Marshview Middle School has been a part of it- collecting thousands of pounds of non-perishable food donations. However, instead of collecting food for the Food Depot Alimentaire in Moncton which redistributes the donations to several locations, Marshview students have walked their donations down to the Sackville Food Bank and helped to sort the donation on the shelves. Our donations stay within **our community to help local families** in need. Our local food bank is also instrumental in supporting Marshview's hot lunch program as well as supporting MMS students in need with snacks and sandwiches throughout the year.

This year, with food items increasing in cost, our local food bank needs our help to stock the shelves. Starting **December 3rd**, Marshview students will begin collecting canned goods and non-perishable food items for our annual Food Bank donation. **We need your help! Donations of canned goods will be collected until the week of December 16th** when we'll put on our Santa and elf hats to deliver items to the Food Bank off Lorne Street.
